Marks of Grace are special droips that can only be obtained while doin Rooftop Agility Corses. They can be spent to buy the graseful set, amylase packs, and are also used to recolor graseful sets. To obtan Marks of Grace you'll need to complete multiple laps of a rooftop agility course, with random marks spawnin every time you complete a lap. These marks will only be visible to the specific player they spawn for, and will despawn after 10 minutes - givin you plenty of time to snag them! The most optimal way to obtain these marks is to complete the highest level rooftop agility course that's available to you, as completin lower-level courses with a significant agility gap can decrease the spawn rate by 20%. For players at levels 40-59 agility, the Canifis Course offers high spawn rates due to its quick completion time. Completing the easy, medium, and hard Kandarin Diary will increase the number of marks you get by 5%, 10%, and 15%, respectively. Additionally, completin the Ardougne Elite Diary will give a 25% increase in mark odds, makin it the best choice for end-game players with the diary completed. The first thing to buy with your Marks of Grace should be the full graseful set, which costs 260 Marks and would take approximately levels 1-58 agility to obtain if you're doin rooftop agility the entire time. Once obtained, you can recolor the set in one of the colors of the Houses of Zeah for 90 Marks of Grace per piece. Amylase Packs, which cost 10 Marks of Grace each, are also a viable option and can be used to create stamina potions or sold on the Grand Exchange for about 93k per 100 amylase. Marks of grace are randomly generated when players traverse obstacles on rooftop courses. Higher-level courses have a higher chance of spawning marks, with each mark appearing on the course giving players 10 minutes to collect it before it disappears. Marks can spawn multiple times on the same tile, increasing the player's total marks and resetting the timer. Players can also obtain additional marks by collecting one mark and advancing through the agility course. However, if a player's Agility level is significantly higher than the required level, their chances of obtaining marks of grace are reduced. Certain achievement diaries completed increase the chance of receiving marks of grace during specific courses. Completing the elite Ardougne Diary grants 25% more marks during that course. Players between levels 40-59 can obtain the most marks on the Canifis Agility Course, which also has a higher experience rate for players training up to level 60. Marks of grace can be traded in at the Rogues' Den for pieces of the graceful outfit and amylase. Each piece's price varies, with some costing more than others. Players can also recolor their outfits by paying different amounts. The price of marks of grace makes each one worth approximately 14,190. Potions are just one part of the equation when it comes to acquiring marks of grace. Another way is by exchanging them with Osten in Shayzien, which allows players to recolour pieces of the graceful outfit. Marks of grace can pop up randomly as you complete laps on certain courses. The higher-level courses have a greater chance of spawning these marks, and they'll only appear for the player who earned them - not for others. You've got 10 minutes to grab a mark before it disappears. Here's the catch: multiple marks can spawn in the same spot, stacking the marks and resetting the timer to 10 minutes. In Ardougne, however, marks can only appear on one tile, and each new mark refreshes the timer. Now, let's talk about achievement diary boosts. Completing the easy, medium, or hard Kandarin Diary increases your chances of getting marks during the Seers' Village Rooftop Course. It's like a reroll, with a 5, 10, or 15 percent chance, respectively. That translates to an effective 10, 20, or 30 percent increase in mark spawning. Similarly, finishing the elite Ardougne Diary adds a 25% reroll on failed mark rolls for the Ardougne Rooftop Course. On top of that, there's a 50% chance the usual 3-minute cooldown is reduced to 2 minutes - which means more marks spawned per hour. For optimal strategies, Canifis Rooftop Course is where it's at. With its higher-than-normal spawn rate and lack of debuff, you can expect around 12-18 marks per hour. But if you time the mark spawns right, you could get up to 20 marks per hour - at the cost of lower Agility experience. Of course, there are trade-offs. If you plan on training Agility beyond what's needed for the graceful outfit, switching to Falador course might be a better bet. It offers 25-50% higher experience rates but sacrifices around 33% of the marks generated. Finally, let's talk about timing those mark spawns. Start your course and note down the minute each lap takes to complete. When you find a mark, wait until the cooldown timer reaches its end before grabbing another one. With patience and strategy, you can maximize your mark collecting! A new mark appears, so repeat the process. If no new marks are found and the lap time is under 60 seconds, complete another lap before the next minute passes. For players who don't want to sacrifice most of their Agility experience per hour for a slightly higher chance at marks of grace, they can take a balanced approach. Instead of waiting, they continue to complete more laps, only pausing when reaching the end of a lap and having less time until the next cooldown minute than it would take to finish another full lap. For example, with a 4-minute cooldown timer, they can complete 3 laps: from 1:30 to 2:15, 2:15 to 3:00, and 3:00 to 3:45. However, when reaching the end of lap 3, they should wait the remaining 15 seconds until 4:00 before completing the lap. This strategy isn't quite optimal as more laps increase the chance of failing obstacles and disrupting optimal course completion timing. Marks of Grace and Rooftop Courses In RuneScape, failing to roll for a mark on certain rooftop courses results in a second chance, depending on Achievement diary completion. Easy, medium, and hard diaries have different second-roll chances for marks on the Seers' Village Rooftop Course. The elite Ardougne diary offers a 25% chance for a mark of grace on its rooftop course. Rooftop courses consistently spawn marks at specific locations within each course. You can buy dark blue recolour for Agility cape with 250 Brimhaven vouchers or get dark dye to change outfit colour by using 300 hallowed marks from Hallowed Sepulchre, then you can also use adventurer's outfit that looks like quest point cape which costs 1,800 Quest Speedrunning points to purchase, and there is a trailblazer kit that you can buy with League Reward Shop points after Trailblazer League finished.
