Biographical Note:

German Clayton Abbott was born just east of Stockton, Missouri on March 9, 1900, to Virgina Francis Hudson and Benjamin Franklin Seth Abbott. Clayton completed the first six grades of school in the Alder District, then entered the seventh grade in Stockton, commuting daily from his home. After five years in the Stockton Schools and a stint in the United States Navy, he attended Southwest Missouri State College (now Missouri State University) at Springfield where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1924. He taught one year in the high school at Momence, Illinois, then enrolled in the University of Wisconsin at Madison and earned a Master of Arts degree in 1926. He later taught school three years in the Philippines and a year and a half in California.

Clayton was first married to Mimi Margelin in California in 1931, and before divorcing in 1946, the couple had three children: Stella, Mary, and James Julius. In 1935, Abbott accepted employment with the California State Employment Service as Supervisor of the Placement Division at Stockton, California. This was at the height of the great influx into California of refugees from the dust bowl areas of the central west, and Abbott directed these migrant workers to employers in the fruit and vegetable growing areas of the San Joaquin Valley.

When World War II began, he was transferred by the Department to Long Beach to the Center of National Defense Activities in the southern part of the state. There he supervised the distribution of war workers to defense jobs throughout the Pacific Coast. After retirement in 1962, Clayton returned to Cedar County and began pursuing his ambition of writing its history. In June of 1967, Clayton Abbott married Mildred Nova Kirkpatrick Nelson, a Stockton High School teacher. He died on October 5, 1987, and is buried at Stockton Cemetery in Stockton, Missouri.

Scope and Content Note:

This collections contains materials related to the history of Cedar County, Missouri, compiled by Clayton Abbott, a local historian and author from Stockton. The material, arranged topically, includes newspaper clippings, transcripts of letters and documents, and drafts of Abbott's writings. The topics include early settlement, churches, schools, the history of El Dorado Springs, stories of the Gold Rush and the Civil War, post offices, and driving tours of Cedar County.

Some of the material in the Abbott collection was used in his writings on local history. Abbott authored or collaborated in several works on Cedar County, including *Historical Sketches of Cedar County* (1967), *Missouri History in Cedar County* (1971) by Clayton Abbott and Lewis B. Hoff, and contributions to *Historical Tours of Cedar County*, *Missouri* (1977).
