Choosing to adopt a homeless pet from Capital Humane Society is a very kind act. We appreciate your willingness to offer a lifetime of love to an animal in need.

The adoption fee includes:

-A health exam by the shelter veterinarian
-Spay/Neuter
-Treatment for fleas, ticks, intestinal parasites or mites
-Heartworm test for canines
-Feline Leukemia/FIV test for felines
-Microchip & Microchip registration
-DA2PP & Bordetella vaccinations for canines
-FVRCP vaccination for felines

Keep in mind, the same basic medical care and treatments would cost \$200 or more at a local vet.

Seniors for Seniors Adoption Program

Seniors for Seniors is a program designed to match up senior pets with senior citizens so both can enjoy the benefits of companionship.

Senior citizens (62+ years old) can receive 50% off their adoption fee if they adopt a senior animal (5+ years old).

Lost & Found: Capital Humane Society microchips all animals before they are put up for adoption to ensure that if you ever experience the dreadful feeling of losing your beloved pet, we can help you find them. Our staff also works diligently to match lost reports to incoming animal calls.

Humane Education: We provide humane education tours and presentations for groups of all ages. We discuss the role Capital Humane Society plays in the community, teach youth the importance of responsible pet care, and emphasize the value of treating animals with kindness and respect.

Low-Cost Feline Spay/Neuter Program:

This program is intended to provide lowincome cat owners with the opportunity to have their cat sterilized, receive basic veterinary treatments, and address the issue of pet overpopulation in our community.
