About this publication

This book provides instructions for installing and using Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios.

Lenovo XClarity Integrator (LXCI) for Nagios is a plug-in for Nagios that integrates with Lenovo XClarity Administrator (LXCA). It monitors the status and alerts, notifies administrator the asserted or de-asserted alerts, and finds potential problems of the Lenovo servers managed by multiple LXCA instances.

What's new in version 1.1.0

This topic provides an overview of features that are new to Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios version 1.1.0.

Monitoring multiple Lenovo XClarity Administrator instances

You can monitor multiple Lenovo XClarity Administrator instances using the same script based on the XClarity Administrator name that is specified when you generate credentials. For more information, refer to Setting up Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios.

Improved help and error handling

Improvements were made to the help content and error handling.

Chapter 1. Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios

Lenovo XClarity Integrator (LXCI) for Nagios is a plug-in for Nagios that integrates with Lenovo XClarity Administrator (LXCA). It monitors the status and alerts, notifies administrator the asserted or de-asserted alerts, and finds potential problems of the Lenovo servers managed by multiple LXCA instances.

XClarity Integrator for Nagios supports the following features.

• View hardware status and alerts for Lenovo hardware that is managed by XClarity Administrator

XClarity Integrator for Nagios supports all device types that are supported by XClarity Administrator, including servers, storage, and switches.

- · Sends an email to an administrator when a new alert is asserted or de-asserted
- Works with other variations, such as Check_MK

Note: Device status and alerts *are not* provided in real-time. The frequency in which alerts and status is retrieved based 1.5 times the check-interval setting that is configured in Nagios.

Chapter 2. Planning and setting up Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios

Use this procedure to plan for and set up Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios.

Software requirements

The following requirements must be met.

- Lenovo XClarity Administrator v2.0 or later
- Nagios core
- OS required package:
 - libssl-dev
- Python v3.5.2 with the following PIP3 packages:
 - cryptography
 - keyring
 - keyrings.cryptfile
 - pbkdf2
 - requests
 - pycrypto

Supported devices

Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios supports all device types that are supported by Lenovo XClarity Administrator, including servers, storage, and switches.

Setting up Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios

Use these steps to setup Lenovo XClarity Integrator for Nagios.

Before you begin

Ensure that the software requirements are met (see Software requirements).

Ensure that Nagios can connect to the target Lenovo XClarity Administrator.

Ensure that ports to the SMTP server are open.

Ensure that XClarity Administrator manages one or more devices that have alerts so that you can verify the setup.

By default, XClarity Integrator for Nagios uses Python sendmail function for sending emails. You can use the default standard Nagios e-mail function or the standard email plugin that you use for all other plugins by configuring the email function in XClarity Integrator for Nagios script

Important: When copying code snippets from this topic, pay special attention to the end-of-line characters, as they are different in Windows and Linux.

Procedure

To set up XClarity Integrator for Nagios, complete the following steps.

Step 1. Download XClarity Integrator for Nagios (xclarity_integrator_check.py) to the /usr/local/ nagios/libexec directory

Note: You can download XClarity Integrator for Nagios from the Nagios Exchange website or Lenovo Support website.

Step 2. Optional: Edit the xclarity_integrator_check.py Python script, and modify the location where you want to store the log_alerts, log_nodes, log_mail and certificate.pem files.

By default, the script creates and saves these files in the /home/nagios/logs directory.

Step 3. Run the /usr/local/nagios/libexec/xclarity_integrator_check.py generate_credentials command to set up XClarity Integrator for Nagios for each appropriate XClarity Administrator instance.

Important: You must run this command as the user that runs the XClarity Integrator for Nagios instance.

When prompted, specify the following data:

- URL for the XClarity Administrator instance (for example, 192.0.2.0)
- User name and password to use to authenticate the XClarity Administrator instance
- · Name that you want to use to identify the XClarity Administrator instance
- Step 4. Optional: Add the certificate for an XClarity Administrator that has a certificate that is signed by a root Certificate Authority by copying the certificate file (in PEM format) to the Nagios log directory.

Use the following format for the certificate file name: certificate.pem<XCLARITY_ ADMINISTRATOR_NAME> (for example, certificate.pemLXCA_1).

Step 5. Update the Nagios configuration files in the /usr/local/nagios/etc/objects directory to add the new plugin.

commands.cfg

1. Add the following definition to send emails.

Important: The options that are specified in the following definition are appended with two dashes.

```
define command{
    command_name    notify-by-email
    command_line    $USER1$/xclarity_integrator_check.py --notificationtype '$NOTIFICATIONTYPE$'
        --servicedesc '$SERVICEDESC$' --hostaddress '$HOSTADDRESS$' --servicestate '$SERVICESTATE$'
        --longdatetime '$LONGDATETIME$' --longserviceoutput '$LONGSERVICEOUTPUT$'
        --hostalias '$HOSTALIAS$' --contactemail '$CONTACTEMAIL$'
}
```

2. Add the following definition to verify the target XClarity Administrator instances. Add a separate definition for each XClarity Administrator instance.

Important: The options that are specified in the following definition are appended with two dashes.

```
define command {
    command_name <XCLARITY_ADMINISTRATOR_NAME>
    command_line $USER1$/xclarity_integrator_check.py --lxca <XCLARITY_ADMINISTRATOR_NAME>
}
```

Where <*XCLARITY_ADMINISTRATOR_NAME*> is the name of the XClarity Administrator instance that you specified in step 3.

For example:

```
define command {
    command_name LXCA_1
    command_line $USER1$/xclarity_integrator_check.py --lxca LXCA_1
}
```

localhost.cfg

Add the following definition for each XClarity Administrator instance.

```
      define service{
      local-service

      use
      local-service

      host_name
      localhost

      service_description
      <XCLARITY_ADMINISTRATOR_NAME>

      check_command
      <XCLARITY_ADMINISTRATOR_NAME>

      notifications_enabled
      1
```

Where <*XCLARITY_ADMINISTRATOR_NAME*> is the name of the XClarity Administrator instance that you specified in step 3.

For example:

define service{	
use	local-service
host_name	localhost
service_description	LXCA_1
check command	LXCA 1
notifications_enabled	1
}	

• contacts.cfg

Add the following definitions to define the email address of the contact or contact group that is to receive emails notifications.

define contact{

use	generic-contact
contact_name	<contact_name></contact_name>
alias	<contact_full_name></contact_full_name>
email	<contact_email< td=""></contact_email<>
service_notification_commands	<service_command< td=""></service_command<>

}

- Where: *CONTACT NAME*>. Short name for the contact
- <CONTACT FULL NAME>. Full name for the contact
- <CONTACT_EMAIL. Contact email address
- <SERVICE_COMMAND. Command that you want to use for sending and receiving emails, To
 use Mailx, specify "notify-by-email." To use the standard Nagios email plugin, do not specify
 a value.

Step 6. Restart Nagios for the changes to take effect.

Step 7. From the Nagios portal, verify that "xclarity_integrator_check" is listed as a service under localhost.

- Step 8. Click xclarity_integrator_check to display the current status, and verify the status is "OK."
- Step 9. Create an alert condition in the target XClarity Administrator. Verify that an email is sent to the specified contacts, for example:
 ****** Nagios *****
