## **INTRODUCTORY RITES**

#### Greeting at the Entrance to the Church

Those who will be acting as your ushers should be at the church one half-hour before the ceremony begins to seat your guests. Be sure to ask your ushers to seat your guests as close to the front of the Cathedral as possible so they will form a united gathering. In a celebration of your unity, there is no need to separate your guests into the bride's side and the groom's side. Seat them together so that they can get to know each other.

#### Entering the Church

The bride and the groom are the ministers of the Sacrament of Marriage; they should enter the assembly from the same door, avoiding any visual statement that says one is more important than the other. They should walk up the aisle together with their attendants, best man and maid of honour, parents and other ministers of the celebration such as a cross bearer, servers and the Priest who will preside at the liturgy. If children are a part of the procession, they must be five years of age or older.

Separation of the men and women in the procession is discouraged. It is improper to start a wedding ceremony separating those who will be acting as couples at the reception after the ceremony. The separation of bride and groom is also not recommended. The two of you are coming together as one, so you should begin that commitment by walking up the aisle together. This is not just the "Bride's Day" and the superstition of not seeing the bride beforehand has no place in a faith-centred ceremony.

Both sets of parents should also be in the opening procession, and the father of the bride does not give away his daughter. That harkens back to Medieval times when women were property and were literally dragged up the aisle to be handed over to the parents of the groom along with a dowry. If the bride wishes to walk with her father, then her mother should also accompany her.

Below, you will find some suggested plans for your entrance into the Cathedral. Keep in mind the bride and groom are at the end of the procession line up.

If there are other attendants, such as Junior Bridesmaids, they should be placed in front of the Groomsmen and Bridesmaids. You may also wish those who will read at your wedding to process in with you. If you have other ideas about the entrance procession, please discuss it at the second interview with the Priest conducting your ceremony.

#### Introduction and Welcome

When all have taken their place, the Priest will make an introduction. He will also state the Cathedral policies regarding photography and the use of confetti. The Priest will then welcome you using one of the following models:

(Please choose one of the following)

- 1. We have come rejoicing into the house of the Lord for this celebration, dear brothers and sisters, and now we stand with N. and N. on the day they intend to form a home of their own. For them this is a moment of unique importance. So let us support them with our affection, with our friendship, and with our prayer as their brothers and sisters. Let us listen attentively with them to the word that God speaks to us today. Then, with holy Church, let us humbly pray to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, for this couple, his servants, that he lovingly accept them, bless them, and make them always one.
- 2. N. and N., the Church shares your joy and warmly welcomes you, together with your families and friends, as today, in the presence of God our Father, you establish between yourselves a lifelong partnership. May the Lord hear you on this your joyful day. May he send you help from heaven and protect you. May he grant you your hearts' desire and fulfill every one of your prayers.

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

Just as there are three readings at Mass, so too are three readings a part of the wedding service. You will need to choose:

- One reading from the Old Testament
- A responsorial psalm (if this is not sung by the cantor/choir)
- A reading from the New Testament
- A Gospel

The first reading is chosen from the Old Testament, except in the Easter Season, when the first reading is traditionally chosen from the Acts of the Apostles or the Book of Revelation.

You will also need to select people to read these readings at your celebration. Make sure that those you choose are comfortable reading in front of a group of people, have an understanding of the Catholic liturgy, and are able to attend the wedding rehearsal to practice their reading.

Make sure you provide your readers with a copy of the readings you have chosen from this booklet. They do not have to bring their copies on the day of the wedding as these readings will be placed in a binder on the Ambo where they will proclaim the Word.

1. Male and female God created them (Genesis 1.26-28, 31a)

#### A reading from the Book of Genesis

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea. and over the birds of the air. and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." So God created man in his image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth." God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good.

1. They become one flesh (Genesis 2.18-24)

## A reading from the book of Genesis

Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and close up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said. "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman. for out of Man this one was taken." Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

3. The Marriage of Isaac and Rebekah (Genesis 24.48-51, 58-67)

#### A reading from the book of Genesis

Abraham's servant said to Laban, "I bowed my head and worshipped the Lord, and blessed the Lord, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way to obtain the daughter of my master's kinsman for his son. Now then, if you will deal loyally and truly with my master, tell me; and if not, tell me, so that I may turn either to the right hand or to the left." Then Laban and Bethuel answered, "The thing comes from the Lord; we cannot speak to you anything bad or good. Look, Rebekah is before you, take her and go, and let her be the wife of your master's son, as the Lord has spoken." Rebekah's mother and brother called her, and asked her, "Will you go with this man?" She said, "I will," So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham's servant and his men. And they blessed Rebekah and said to her, "May you, our sister, become thousands of myriads; may your offspring gain possession of the gates of their foes." Then Rebekah and her maids rose up. mounted the camels, and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah, and went his way.

3. The Marriage of Isaac and Rebekah (Genesis 24.48-51, 58-67) (Continued from page 8)

Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi, and was settled in the Negev.
Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field; and looking up, he saw camels coming.
And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel, and said to the servant,
"Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?"
The servant said, "It is my master."
So Rebekah took her veil and covered herself.
And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done.
Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent.
He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her.
So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

## 4. The Marriage of Tobias and Sarah (Tobit 7.6-14)

#### A reading from the book of Tobit

Raguel jumped up and kissed Tobias and wept. He also spoke to him as follows, "Blessings on you, my child, son of a good and noble father! O most miserable of calamities that such an upright and beneficent man has become blind!" He then embraced his kinsman Tobias and wept. His wife Edna also wept for him, and their daughter Sarah likewise wept. Then Raguel slaughtered a ram from the flock and received them very warmly. When they had bathed and washed themselves and had reclined to dine, Tobias said to Raphael, "Brother Azariah, ask Raguel to give me my kinswoman Sarah." But Raguel overheard it and said to the lad, "Eat and drink, and be merry tonight. For no one except you, brother, has the right to marry my daughter Sarah. Likewise I am not at liberty to giver her to any other man than yourself because you are my nearest relative. But let me explain to you the true situation more fully, my child. I have give her to seven men of our kinsmen, and all died on the night when they went in to her. Bu now, my child, eat and drink, and the Lord will act on behalf of you both."

5. Grant that we may grow old together (Tobit 8.4b-8)

#### A reading from the book of Tobit

On their wedding night, Tobias got out of bed and said to Sarah, "Sister, get up, and let us pray and implore our Lord that he may grant us mercy and safety." So she got up, and they began to implore that they might be kept safe. Tobias began by saying, "Blessed are you, O God of our fathers, and blessed is your name in all generations forever. Let the heavens and the whole creation bless you forever. You made Adam, and for him you made his wife Eve as a helper and support. From the two of them the human race has sprung. You said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; let us make a helper for him like himself.' I now am taking this kinswoman of mine, not because of lust, but with sincerity. Grant that she and I may find mercy and that we may grow old together." And they both said, "Amen, Amen."

#### 6. Love Is A Divine Fire

(Song of Songs 2.8-10, 14, 16a; 8.6-7a)

#### A reading from the Songs of Songs

The voice of my beloved! Look, he comes, leaping upon the mountains, bounding over the hills. My beloved is like a gazelle or a young stag. Look, there he stands behind our wall, gazing in at the windows, looking through the lattice. My beloved speaks and says to me: "Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away; O my dove, in the clefts of the rock, in the covert of the cliff, let me see your face, let me hear your voice; for your voice is sweet, and your face is lovely." My beloved is mine and I am his. "Set me as a seal upon your heart, as a seal upon your arm; for love is strong as death, passion fierce as the grave. Love's flashes are flashes of fire, a raging flame. Many waters cannot quench love, neither can floods drown it."

7. Woman; The Light of the Home (Sirach 26.1-4, 13-16)

#### A reading from the book of Sirach

Blessed is the husband of a good wife; the numbers of his days will be doubled. A loyal wife brings joy to her husband, and he will complete his years in peace. A good wife is a great blessing; she will be granted among the blessings of the man who fears the Lord. Whether rich or poor, his heart is content, and at all times his face is cheerful. A wife's charm delights her husband, and her skill puts flesh on his bones. A silent wife is a gift from the Lord, and nothing is so precious as her self-discipline. A modest wife adds charm to charm, and no scales can weigh the value of her chastity. Like the sun rising in the heights of the Lord, so is the beauty of a good wife in her well-ordered home.

#### 8. God Makes a Covenant

(Jeremiah 31.31-32a, 33-34a)

#### A reading from the book of the Prophet Jeremiah

The days are surely come, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their fathers when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. But this covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord.

The Responsorial Psalms give us words for responding to the Old Testament Readings. Since they are often sung, you can find settings for them in the Catholic Book of Worship III. If it is not sung, it is read, so you will need another reader.

#### 9. Psalm 33

The steadfast love of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear him, and his righteousness to children's children, to those who keep his covenant.

Refrain: The Lord is merciful and gracious.

#### 12. Psalm 112

Refrain: Blessed is the one who greatly delights in the Lord's commandments.

Blessed is the one who fears the Lord, who greatly delights in his commandments. Their descendants will be mighty in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed.

Refrain: Blessed is the one who greatly delights in the Lord's commandments.

Wealth and riches are in their house, and their righteousness endures forever. Light rises in the darkness for the upright: gracious, merciful and righteous.

Refrain: Blessed is the one who greatly delights in the Lord's commandments.

It is well with the person who deals generously and lends, who conducts their affairs with justice. For the righteous person will never be moved; they will be remembered forever, unafraid of evil tidings.

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God what is good and acceptable and perfect. Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection: outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints: extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. 19. Faith, hope and love abide; the greatest of these is love (1 Corinthians 12.31-13.8a)

## A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians.

Brothers and sisters, strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in the tongues of human beings and of Angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.

20a. Live in Love, Like Christ - regular version (Ephesians 5.2a, 21-33)

## A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians.

Brothers and sisters:

Live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us. Be subject to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, be subject to your husbands as you are to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife iust as Christ is the head of the Church. the body of which he is the Saviour. Just as the Church is subject to Christ, so also wives ought to be, in everything, to their husbands. Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her, in order to make her holy by cleansing her with the washing of water by the word, so as to present the Church to himself in splendour, without a spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind yes, so that she may be holy and without blemish. In the same way, husbands should love their wives as they do their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. # 21. Love is the Bond of Perfection (Colossians 3.12-17)

## A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Colossians.

Brothers and sisters:
As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved,
clothe yourselves with compassion,
kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.
Bear with one another and,
if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other;
just as the Lord has forgiven you,
so you also must forgive.
Above all, clothe yourselves with love,
which binds everything together in perfect harmony.
And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts,
to which indeed you were called in the one body.
And be thankful.
Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly;
teach and admonish one another in all wisdom;
and with gratitude in your hearts

teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

22. The Unity and Peace of the Christian Home (1 Peter 3.1-9)

## A reading from the first Letter of Saint Peter.

Wives, accept the authority of your husbands, so that, even if some of them do not obey the word, they may be won over without a word by their wives' conduct, when they see the purity and reverence of your lives. Do not adorn yourselves outwardly by braiding your hair, and by wearing gold ornaments or fine clothing; rather, let your adornment by the inner self with the lasting beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in God's sight. It was in this way long ago, that the holy women who hoped in God used to adorn themselves by accepting the authority of their husbands. Thus Sarah obeyed Abraham and called him lord. You have become her daughters as long as you do what is good and never let fears alarm you. Husbands, in the same way, show consideration for your wives in your life together, paying honour to the woman as the weaker sex, since they too are also heirs of the gracious gift of life so that nothing may hinder your prayers. Finally, all of you, have unity of spirit, sympathy, love for one another, a tender heart, and a humble mind. Do not repay evil for evil or abuse for abuse; but, on the contrary, repay with a blessing. It is for this that you were called that you might inherit a blessing.

23. A True Love (1 John 3.18-24)

#### A reading from the first Letter of Saint John.

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us: for God is greater than our hearts, and God knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God: and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment. that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. Whoever obeys his commandments abides in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

24. God Is Love (1 John 4.7-12)

#### A reading from the first Letter of Saint John.

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

## **NEW TESTAMENT READINGS**

# 25. The Wedding Feast (Revelation 19.1,5-9a)

A reading from the book of Revelation.

After this, I, John, heard what seemed to be the loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, saying, "Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power to our God." And from the throne came a voice saying, "Praise our God, all you his servants, and all who fear him, small and great." Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready; to her it has been granted to be clothed with fine linen, bright and pure" for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints. And the Angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb."

The word of the Lord.

26. This is the greatest and first commandment (Matthew 22.35-40)

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

One of the Pharisees, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the Law is the greatest?"

Jesus said to him,

"'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.'
This is the greatest and first commandment.

And a second is like it:

'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.'

On these two commandments hang all the law and the Prophets."

27. They are no longer two, but one flesh (Mark 10.6-9)

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

Jesus said,
"From the beginning of creation,

'God made them male and female.'

'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.'

So they are no longer two, but one flesh.

Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

# 28. Jesus is Present at the Wedding (John 2.1-11)

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rite of purification, each holding about a hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), The steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

29. Abide in my love (John 2.1-11)

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love.

If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.

I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

30. This is my commandment, that you love one another (John 15.12-16)

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus said to his disciples:
"This is my commandment,
that you love one another as I have loved you.
No one has greater love than this,
to lay down one's life for one's friends.
You are my friends if you do what I command you.
I do not call you servants any longer,
because the servant does not know what the master is doing;
but I have called you friends,
because I have made known to you everything
that I have heard from my Father.
You did not choose me but I chose you.
And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last,
so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name."

31a. That they may become completely one (John 17.20-26)

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus looked up to heaven and prayed: "Holy Father, I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you; and these know that you have sent me. I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."

## HOMILY

The homily is an important moment in your marriage ceremony. The Priest will reflect and comment on the meaning of your marriage, and its sacramental nature, in the light of God's Word.

## LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

#### Preparation Dialogue

After the homily, the couple will move in front of the altar and the Priest addresses them in these words:

My dear friends, you have come together in this church so that the Lord may seal and strengthen your love in the presence of the Church's minister and this community. Christ abundantly blesses this love. He has already consecrated you in Baptism and now, he enriches and strengthens you by a special sacrament so that you may assume the duties of marriage in mutual and lasting fidelity. And so, in the presence of the Church, I ask you to state your intentions.

#### Statement of Intentions

The Priest now asks the couple the following three questions. Each of you will answer in a clear, loud voice so that all may hear.

- 1. N. and N., have you come here freely and without reservation to give yourself to each other in marriage?
- 2. Will you love and honour each other as man and wife for the rest of your lives?

(The following question may be omitted if, for example, the couple is of advanced age.)

3. Will you accept children lovingly from God, and bring them up according to the law of Christ and His Church?

#### Declaration of Consent

This is the central moment in the celebration of your marriage. Hand in hand, you will give yourselves to each other by a mutual gift of love. Your commitment is made in Jesus Christ. By your consent, you enter the Sacrament of Matrimony.

The Priest now invites the couple to join their right hands as he says:

Since it is your intention to enter into marriage, join your right hands and declare your consent before God and His Church.

## The Groom says:

I,....., take you,....., to be my wife.
I promise to be faithful to you in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health,
I will love you and honour you all the days of my life.

#### The Bride then says:

I,....., take you,....., to be my husband.
I promise to be faithful to you in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health,
I will love you and honour you all the days of my life.

#### The following alternative form may be used:

#### The Groom says:

I,....., take you,....., for my lawful wife, to have and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish until death do us part.

#### The Bride then says:

I,....., take you,....., for my lawful husband, to have and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish until death do us part.

#### Blessing of the Rings

Following your Declaration of Consent, the Priest will bless the rings, using one of the following prayers:

(Please choose one of the following)

- 1. May the Lord bless ★ these rings which you give to each other as the sign of your love and fidelity. *R*. Amen.
- 2. Lord, bless these rings which we bless ♣ in your name. Grant that those who wear them may always have a deep faith in each other. May they do your will and always live together in peace, good will, and love. R. Amen.
- 3. Lord, bless ♣ and consecrate N. and N. in their love for each other. May these rings be a symbol of true faith in each other, and always remind them of their love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.

#### Exchange of the Rings

The covenant between husband and wife that marriage celebrates is also a sign of the covenant between God and His people, between Christ and His Church. The covenant that flows from your Declaration of Consent is symbolized in the exchanging of the rings. After the blessing, the Priest will invite you to give the rings to each other. As you do so, you say the following words:

As the bridegroom places the ring on the bride's finger he says:

N., take this ring as a sign of my love and fidelity. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

As the bride places the ring on the bridegroom's finger she says:

N., take this ring as a sign of my love and fidelity. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

After the rings have been exchanged, the Priest may invite the couple to seal their covenant with each other, and with God, with a kiss.

#### General Intercessions

The Liturgy of the Word now resumes as the community who are present offer their prayers for the newly wed couple. These prayers are directed toward your life and happiness together.

Choose one between option A or option B. You will also need to choose someone to read these prayers.

The response to each prayer is: Lord, hear our prayer.

#### Α.

- 1. That he will bless their covenant as he chose to sanctify marriage at Cana in Galilee, let us pray to the Lord.
- 2. That they be granted perfect and fruitful love, peach and strength, and that they bear faithful witness to the name of Christian, let us pray to the Lord.
- 3. That the Christian people may grow in virtue day by day and that all who are burdened by any need may receive the help of grace from above, let us pray to the Lord.
- 4. That the grace of the Sacrament will be renewed by the Holy Spirit in all married persons here present, let us pray to the Lord.

#### В.

- 1. For their relatives and friends, and for all who have assisted this couple, let us pray to the Lord.
- 2. For young people preparing to enter Marriage, and for all whom the Lord is calling to another state in life, let us pray to the Lord.
- 3. For all families throughout the world and for lasting peace among all people, let us pray to the Lord.
- 4. For all members of our families who have passed from this world, and for all the departed, let us pray to the Lord.
- 5. For the Church, the holy People of God, and for unity among all Christians, let us pray to the Lord.

# LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

If both of you are Roman Catholic, your marriage will be celebrated within the context of the Eucharist. The celebration of the Eucharist at a wedding gives you, the newly wed couple, your parents, your relatives, and your friends, a chance to unite yourselves with Jesus as He offers His life to the Father and gives Himself to us.

#### Communion

If you are celebrating the Eucharist at your wedding, the bride and groom, as well as the maid of honour and the best man, if they are both Catholic, will receive communion under both forms: bread and wine. Please inform the Priest if there is a problem with this.

The communion hymn is sung while the congregation receives communion. It should be a congregational hymn that speaks of our sharing in the Lord's Body and Blood - not a solo.

#### **Mass Prayers**

Of the three formulas which follow, choose the one that has the most meaning for you.

If you are marrying an unbaptized person, Set 3 is the one that must be used.

(Please choose one set of the Mass Prayers)

#### Set 1

#### Collect:

Be attentive to our prayers, O Lord, and in your kindness uphold what you have established for the increase of the human race, so that the union you have created may be kept safe by your assistance. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, on God, forever and ever.

#### OR

O God, who in creating the human race willed that man and wife should be one, join, we pray, in a bond of inseparable love these your servants who are to be united in the covenant of Marriage, so that, as you make their love fruitful, they may become, by your grace, witnesses to charity itself. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, on God, forever and ever.

#### Nuptial Blessing:

#### The Priest invites all to pray:

Dear brothers and sisters, let us humbly pray to the Lord that on these his servants, now married in Christ, he may mercifully pour out the blessing of his grace and make of one heart in love (by the Sacrament of Christ's Body and blood) those he has joined by a holy covenant.

#### All pray silently for a moment. Then the Priest continues:

O God, who by your mighty power created all things out of nothing, and, when you had set in place the beginnings of the universe, formed man and woman in your own image, making the woman an inseparable helpmate to the man, that they might no longer be two, but one flesh, and taught that what you were pleased to make one must never be divided;

O God, who consecrated the bond of Marriage by so great a mystery that in the wedding covenant you foreshadowed the Sacrament of Christ and his Church;

O God, by whom woman is joined to man and the companionship they had in the beginning is endowed with the one blessing not forfeited by original sin nor washed away by the flood.

Look now with favour on these your servants, joined together in Marriage, who ask to be strengthened by your blessing. Send down on them the grace of the Holy Spirit and pour your love into their hearts, that they may remain faithful in the Marriage covenant.

May the grace of love and peace abide in your daughter N., and let her always follow the example of those holy women whose praises are sung in the Scriptures. May her husband entrust his heart to her, so that, acknowledging her as his equal and his joint heir to the life of grace, he may show her due honour and cherish her always with the love that Christ has for his Church.

And now, Lord, we implore you: may these your servants hold fast to the faith and keep your commandments; made one in the flesh, may they be blameless in all they do; and with the strength that comes from the Gospel, may they bear true witness to Christ before all; (may they be blessed with children, and prove themselves virtuous parents, who live to see their children's children)

And grant that, reaching at last together the fullness of years for which they hope, they may come to the life of the blessed in the Kingdom of Heaven. Through Christ our Lord.

#### **Prayer After Communion:**

By the power of this sacrifice, O Lord, accompany with your loving favour what in your providence you have instituted, so as to make of one heart in love those you have already joined in this holy union (and replenished with the one Bread and the one Chalice) Through Christ our Lord.

#### Solemn Blessing at the End of Mass:

May God the eternal Father keep you of one heart in love for one another, that the peace of Christ may dwell in you and abide always in your home.

May you be blessed in your children, have solace in your friends and enjoy true peace with everyone.

May you be witnesses in the world to God's charity, so that the afflicted and needy who have known your kindness may one day receive you thankfully into the eternal dwelling of God.

#### Set 2

#### Collect:

Be attentive to our prayers, O Lord, and in your kindness pour out your grace on these your servants (N. and N.), that, coming together before your altar, they may be confirmed in love for one another. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, on God, forever and ever.

#### OR

O God, who consecrated the bond of Marriage by so great a mystery that in the wedding covenant you foreshadow the Sacrament of Christ and his Church, grant, we pray, to these your servants, that what they receive in faith they may live out in deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, on God, forever and ever.

#### Nuptial Blessing:

#### The Priest invites all to pray:

Let us pray to the Lord for this bride and groom, who come to the altar as they begin their married life, that (partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ) they may always be bound together by love for one another.

#### All pray silently for a moment. Then the Priest continues:

Holy Father, who formed man in your own image and male and female you created them, so that as husband and wife united in body and heart, they might fulfill their calling in this world.

O God, who, to reveal the great design you formed in your love, willed that the love of spouses for each other should foreshadow the covenant you graciously made with your people, so that, by

fulfillment of the sacramental sign, the mystical marriage of Christ with his Church might become manifest in the union of husband and wife among your faithful;

Graciously stretch out your right hand over these your servants (N. and N.), we pray, and pour into their hearts the power of the Holy Spirit. Grant, O Lord, that, as they enter upon this sacramental union, they may share with one another the gifts of your love and, by being for each other a sign of your presence, become one heart and one mind. May they also sustain, O Lord, by their deeds the home they are forming (and prepare their children to become members of your heavenly household by raising them in the way of the Gospel).

Graciously crown with your blessings your daughter N., so that, by being a good wife (and mother), she may bring warmth to her home with a love that is pure and adorn it with welcoming graciousness.

Bestow a heavenly blessing also, O Lord, on N., your servant, that he may be a worthy, good and faithful husband (and a provident father). Grant, holy Father, that, desiring to approach your table as a couple joined in Marriage in your presence, they may one day have the joy of taking part in your great banquet in heaven. Through Christ our Lord.

## **Prayer After Communion:**

Having been made partakers at your table, we pray, O Lord, that those who are united by the Sacrament of Marriage may always hold fast to you and proclaim your name to the world. Through Christ our Lord.

# Solemn Blessing at the End of Mass:

May God the all-powerful Father grant you his joy (and bless you in your children.)

May the Only Begotten Son of God stand by you with compassion in good times and in bad.

May the Holy Spirit of God always pour forth his love into your hearts.

## <u>Set 3</u>

#### Collect:

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that these your servants, now to be joined by the Sacrament of Matrimony, may grow in the faith they profess and enrich your Church with faithful offspring. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, on God, forever and ever.

#### OR

O God, who since the beginning of the world have blessed the increase of offspring, show favour to our supplications and pour forth the help of your blessing on these your servants (N. and N.), so that in the union of Marriage they may be bound together in mutual affection, in likeness of mind, and in shared holiness. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, on God, forever and ever.

#### Nuptial Blessing:

#### The Priest says:

Let us humbly invoke by our prayers, dear brothers and sisters, God's blessing upon this bride and groom, that in his kindness he may favour with his help those on whom he has bestowed the Sacrament of Matrimony.

#### All pray silently for a moment. Then the Priest continues:

Holy Father, maker of the whole world, who created man and woman in your own image and willed that their union be crowned with your blessing, we humbly beseech you for these your servants, who are joined today in the Sacrament of Matrimony.

May your abundant blessing, Lord, come down upon this bride, N., and upon N., her companion for life, and may the power of your Holy Spirit set their hearts aflame from on high, so that, living out together the gift of Matrimony, they may (adorn their family with children and) enrich the Church.

In happiness may they praise you, O Lord, in sorrow may they seek you out; may they have the joy of your presence to assist them in their toil, and know that you are near to comfort them in their need; let them pray to you in the holy assembly and bear witness to you in the world, and after a happy old age, together with the circle of friends that surrounds them, may them come to the Kingdom of Heaven. Through Christ our Lord.

#### Prayer After Communion:

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that the power of the Sacrament we have received may find growth in these your servants and that the effects of the sacrifice we have offered may be felt by us all. Through Christ our Lord.

#### Solemn Blessing at the End of Mass:

May the Lord Jesus, who graced the marriage at Cana by his presence bless you and your loved ones.

May he who loved the Church to the end, unceasingly pour his love into your hearts.

May the Lord grant that, bearing witness to faith in his Resurrection, you may await with joy the blessed hope to come.

## Signing of the Register and Recessional

The Priest will instruct everyone to sit down while the couple and their witnesses come to the altar to sign the register. A solo, or instrumental song may be done at this time. The Priest will then give the wedding certificate to the groom and introduce the newly married couple to the congregation.

As the music plays, the couple and their attendants will leave the church.
